The **College of Veterinary Medicine of Urmia University**, was founded in 1973 in Agriculture college campus with efforts of Dr. Aziz Rafie . Dr. Mansour Edalat was chosen as the head of the college and served from 1973- 1977. The newly established department was initially included Pathology, Parasitology, Mycology, Bacteriology, Epidemiology, Virology and Immunology groups, but as the department matured and for improving of the quality of education and research many units merged and separated as different departments. At present the department of pathobiology spans the pathology and parasitology groups. The department hosts residency programs in anatomic pathology and parasitology and masteral courses in parasitology.
